Tzedakah is a Hebrew word that refers to what we call in English "charity," meaning the act of giving aid, assistance, and money to those experiencing poverty, those in need, and other worthy causes. The word is actually derived from words meaning "justice" and "righteousness.

In Judaism, Tzedakah is considered one of three acts that can gain us forgiveness of our sins; repentance and prayer are the other two. Some sages refer to it as the greatest commandment. For Christians, it is worth noting a strong emphasis on almsgiving in the Gospels!



It is worth noting that in Judaism, there are different levels of Tzedakah. It begins with giving grudgingly, then giving less than you can, but joyfully; then giving after you have been asked; then giving without being asked; then giving when the recipient knows, when the recipient doesn't know, and when neither knows the donor's name. Finally, the highest level of Tzedakah is giving that enables the recipient to become self-reliant!

The projects that you support through the Ministry of the Good Shepherd - CETPRO, Care Centers, Scholarships, and Send a Child to School- are especially focused on that last motive!

In 2025, 144 children were registered in the Reading Plan at the San Jose Library to foster a love of reading. Its objective is to promote daily reading across all subject areas, including diverse types of texts, and to strengthen reading comprehension.

More than 20 years ago, with enthusiasm and lots of faith, the Sisters of Mercy and members of the Community in Alto Trujillo broke ground for the San Jose Library. None of the enthusiastic members of the Ministry even dreamed about the continuation of this mission for decades. This mission was initiated with the goal of providing people in need with the opportunity for a better future. Alto Trujillo is no longer what it was 30 years ago; the community has grown, and with that, the demand for the programs offered by the Sisters has also increased. It is not only the reading plan, religious education, or assistance with homework, but what the community mainly values is a safe environment, learning opportunities, and protection from the dangers of the street, offered to the kids and youths.

One of the challenges in recent years has been the limited space, resulting from high demand for programs. Just as 30 years ago, we now have a new dream: to expand the existing construction and add new areas for our programs. Your generosity towards this project will be much appreciated. The Lord of the Miracles is Peru's most revered religious icon and a major national symbol. The annual commemoration in October is one of the largest religious processions in the world and a cornerstone of Peruvian cultural identity. It has been held every October since 1687.
